## ANN UAL REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE FOR 1973-1974.

The Club in its fourth year, has again had a very successful season. We finished second in the Centre Competition from fifth in the previous year. The number of places won in Centre championships were tripled; averages attendances were well up on 1972-73 and the Club is now in a sound financial position.

## COMMITTEE

Committee meetings have been held regularly during the year at the homes of the members and have been well attended. We were sorry to lose our President elect, Mr. Murray Lang, just before the start of the season. Murray was unanimously appointed the start of the Centre to fill the vacancy left by the resign-President of the Centre to fill the vacancy left by the resignation of Mr. Ian Beaith, but to pressure of business had to relinquish his position with the Club.
