It has been great to hear of the strong attendance RLAC has had at training sessions on Wednesday evenings. Many thanks must go to our coach Grant King along with Linda Langford, and Anthony Crabtree for their dedication in attending weekly training to help develop the skills of our athletes.

Earlier in the year the Diamond Valley Executive Committee along with delegates from each voted to include Under 16 competition to the Diamond Valley program. Due to this we are pleased to not yet have to farewell our senior athletes but hope to watch their development for a further year. We wish them the best of luck in their final season at little athletics.

RLAC has been kindly supported by many local businesses throughout the season. Rosanna Team Managers Report 2009/10

The 2009/2010 season for RLAC has been a highly successful season. Building on last year's progress as a club we challenged ourselves in a number of areas. The Personal Best Program, with the bar set at 1181 was beaten with a week to spare, followed by an amazing 120PB's in the weekend of Centre Champs bringing our total to 1287! A fantastic job by all athletes.

One goal the club had this season was to put together a participation program for the U6/7 On-track to encourage them to attend weekly. This proved highly successful, with all but one attending more than 50% of weekly competition.

Another club policy this season was to encourage the U7 On-track to participate in Region Relay, Multi and Track and Field Championships to gain experience for the next season when they will compete weekly. The results were encouraging with the U7 helping DVLAC achieve better results in their junior categories. The feedback from U7 was that they enjoyed the experience.

As a club Rosanna, given their results at centre level and high participation rate at region and state has elevated themselves to second behind Greenbriar as the most successful club this season.

Here is a snapshot of the season that WAZ (was):

- © 62 athletes compete at centre relays with 48 receiving medals. Up 77% compared to last season 60%.
- © Rosanna came second at the Centre Multi Championship.
- At the Region Multi Championships Rosanna had 25 Athletes (up from 6 last year) compete on behalf of DVLAC with:
 - √ four top 10 finishes ,
 - √ 6 top five finishes, and
 - ✓ 6 receiving medals. Of the 25 athletes who competed 16 finished in the top ten!

A great result!

- At the State Multi Championships 5 Rosanna Athletes competed resulting in two top 10 finishes and one medaling.
- © 59 Rosanna athletes entered to compete at Centre Track and Field resulting in 30 medals.

- 35 Rosanna athletes competed at Region Track and Field, an increase from 21 last season. Of this, 19 were from U9-U15 age group, of which 13 progressed to state. 16 U6-U7 athletes competed which is a huge increase from 4 last year. This highlights our policy in helping our Under 7 athletes gain competition experience before they progress to U8. Of those 16, 3 made it to finals with a further 5 winning medals.
- © 13 Rosanna athletes qualified to compete at the State Track and Field Championships with 5 finalists, 1 of those medaling.
- 9 Club Records and 1 centre record were broken this season.
- © Rosanna has won 4 age group awards out of a possible 14 this season.

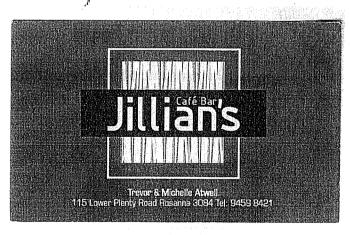

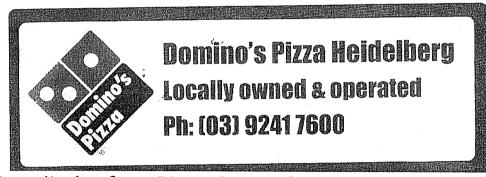
